

From the Supreme Basileus

Greetings Soror,

Over the last few days, I have been in constant communication with the North Atlantic Regional Director, Soror Meredith L. Henderson, pertaining to the rioting in Baltimore following the killing of Freddie Gray. As the state of emergency continues within the city, we must continue to pray, encourage those affected by this crisis and speak out against the continuing acts of injustice plaguing our country.

At this time, we are coming together to provide additional financial assistance to support relief and revitalization efforts in Baltimore. Contributions will be used to support the financial needs of the community, including feeding senior citizens and youth, assisting with prescription co-pays, transporting seniors, rebuilding local businesses and rebuilding the Senior Center that was burnt down in East Baltimore. The Corporate Office along with the North Atlantic Region are also sending water and other necessary supplies to be distributed to the local community on behalf of the international organization. Contributions can be made in the "Members only section" online store at www.aka1908.com. Sorors may enter any amount starting at \$1. Chapters wishing to contribute by check may send contributions directly to the Corporate Office with a note stating that the donation is earmarked for the Baltimore Relief Fund.

In response to the rioting and ongoing unrest in the Baltimore area, we quickly deployed our chapters (Epsilon Omega, Rho Xi Omega, Upsilon Epsilon Omega, and Psi Phi Omega) and members to provide relief, resources, and comfort to those most in need in the Baltimore community.

- Members of Metro Baltimore chapters partnered to provide food, care packages, and medication to the seniors at Penn North Plaza Senior building who were directly affected by the looting and burning of their neighborhood CVS Pharmacy.
- Sorors have transported seniors to pick up prescriptions and groceries. In many cases, sorors were able to work with the pharmacies to get co-pays waived.
- Sorors manned three stations set up at local playgrounds, passing out snacks and beverages to the kids in the immediate affected areas where school was not in session.
- Sorors participated in a community meeting with local officials and community leaders on April 28, 2015 to continue to organize community clean-up plans.
- Sorors stood alongside the men of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. during a silent vigil on April 28, 2015.
- The Ivy Center in Baltimore will serve as a staging ground/support center for any organization or government agency in need of temporary space. They will also serve as a meet up location for sorors who desire to volunteer.

In addition, members are working with community leaders and local officials on a plan for healing and action following the senseless death of Freddie Gray while in police custody.

As we have for the past 107 years, we will come together to support our Sorors and those in most need of our service and support. As we support the Baltimore community and Mayor and AKA Member, Soror Stephanie Rawlings-Blake, we will also remain steadily focused on ensuring that we fight against the injustices in our country. Thank you in advance for your continued encouragement, compassion, prayers, and never-ending fight for justice for the people around this country.

Target II: Health Promotion




