

Did You Know This About Our Sisterhood??????

The fourteenth Supreme Basileus, Soror Arnetta G. Wallace was born and raised in Knoxville, Tennessee. She graduated from Knoxville College and completed graduate work at Tennessee A and I (now Tennessee State University). In addition to being a leader in our sisterhood, Soror Wallace was also the president of the Tennessee Education Congress (the equivalent to the Tennessee Education Association for Black teachers prior to integration) and National Chairman of the National Pan Hellenic Council. Soror Wallace was also very active in the Civil Rights Movement in 1962. She encouraged young workers in schools in Mississippi to register to vote and was involved in organizing voter registration drive throughout the state. During Soror Wallace's administration our sisterhood experienced tremendous growth which led to the chartering of the first international chapter in Liberia.


